Residents of southeastern Wisconsin and the Milwaukee metropolitan area who sustained storm damage this month, may find useful insurance information at our website.

“Settling Insurance Claims After a Disaster,” is also available upon request. This free brochure contains information about how to file an insurance claim, how the claims process works and what is

covered and what is not covered under the typical property and auto insurance policy.

Flood damage, for instance, is not covered by standard homeowners insurance, but flood insurance may be purchased separately from the National Flood Insurance Program. (see below)

Flood Insurance is for Everyone



Flood damage can affect any property, even those that are miles away from bodies of water.

In fact, 25-30 % of flood claims come from low to moderate risk areas.

According to FEMA, if you live in a low to moderate risk area, a flood policy can cost as low as \$119 a year.

Homeowners, renters and business owners are eligible for this federal insurance program.

To obtain more information, contact your home, renters or business insurance agent. You

can also visit the National Flood Insurance website: FloodSmart.gov.

Don't wait. A policy takes 30 days from application to effective date of coverage.

Mandatory Auto Insurance Effective June 1, 2010

Mandatory auto insurance has been in effect in Wisconsin for nearly 60 days.
